No. 9/WAT/2026 of 26 February 2026**

**on the determination of the Rules of recruitment  
to the Doctoral School of the Military University of Technology  
for the academic year 2026/2027**

Pursuant to Article 200(2) of the Act of 20 July 2018 – Law on Higher Education and Science (i.e. Journal of Laws of 2024, item 1571, as amended). In connection with § 21(1)(27) of the Statute of the Military University of Technology attached to the Resolution of the Senate of the Military University of Technology No. 16/WAT/2019 of 25 April 2019 on the adoption of the Statute of the Military University of Technology (i.e. the Announcement of the Rector of the Military University of Technology No. 2/WAT/2024 of 27 March 2024), the following is hereby resolved: as follows:

**§ 1**

The "Rules of Recruitment to the Military University of Technology Doctoral School for the academic year 2026/2027" *is hereby defined*, constituting an annex to the resolution.

**§ 2**

The resolution enters into force on the day of its adoption.

**Rules of recruitment  
to the Doctoral School of the Military University of Technology  
for the academic year 2026/2027**

**Section I  
General**

**§ 1**

1. The Doctoral School of the Military University of Technology, hereinafter referred to as the "Doctoral School", is recruiting persons hereinafter referred to as "candidates" for the academic year 2026/2027, in the following scientific disciplines:
  - 1) automation, electronics, electrical engineering and space technologies,
  - 2) technical informatics and telecommunications,
  - 3) civil engineering, geodesy and transport,
  - 4) materials engineering,
  - 5) mechanical engineering,
  - 6) safety sciences,
  - 7) chemical sciences.
2. The purpose of the recruitment procedure is to select the best candidates for education at the Doctoral School.
3. Recruitment to the Doctoral School is carried out by means of a competition in accordance with these Rules of Admission to the Doctoral School of the Military University of Technology for the academic year 2026/2027, hereinafter referred to as the "Recruitment Rules".
4. In the case of recruitment to the Doctoral School in scientific disciplines, within the framework of which education will be carried out in English, the recruitment procedure is conducted in English.
5. Recruitment of foreigners to the Doctoral School is carried out on the same terms as those applicable to Polish citizens, taking into account the provisions of the Act of 20 July 2018 - Law on Higher Education and Science (i.e. Journal of Laws of 2024, item 1571, as amended), hereinafter referred to as the "Act".
6. The rules and procedure for directing professional soldiers to the Doctoral School in the official mode are regulated by the provisions of the Act of 11 March 2022 on the Defence of the Homeland (i.e. Journal of Laws of 2024, item 248, as amended).
7. The limit of places for the Doctoral School is set by the Rector by 30 April 2026, at the request of the Director of the Doctoral School, hereinafter referred to as the "Director".
8. By 30 April 2026, the Scientific Disciplinary Councils will establish lists of potential supervisors along with the thematic scope of the research.
9. The Councils of Scientific Disciplines may make changes to the lists referred to in paragraph 8 by 31 July 2026.
10. The resolutions referred to in paragraphs 8 and 9 shall be immediately forwarded by the Chairman of the Council of Scientific Discipline to the Director.
11. Documents submitted in the recruitment process that require a signature can be signed by hand, with a qualified signature or with a trusted profile.

12. Whenever these recruitment rules refer to:
  - 1) candidates with special needs - this means a candidate, including a candidate with disabilities, who, due to his or her external or internal characteristics, or due to the circumstances in which he or she finds himself, needs to take additional measures or apply additional measures to overcome the barrier to participate in recruitment on an equal basis with other persons;
  - 2) reasonable accommodations - this means necessary and appropriate changes and adjustments, not imposing a disproportionate or excessive burden, if necessary in a specific case (in an individual situation), in order to ensure that candidates with special needs, including disabilities, have the opportunity to participate in the recruitment process on an equal basis with other persons.
13. Candidates with special needs are subject to the same recruitment rules as other candidates applying for admission to the Doctoral School, subject to § 11 sections 6 and 7 and § 14 section 2.

## **Section II**

### **Recruitment committee and qualification teams**

#### § 2

1. To conduct the admission procedure to the Doctoral School, at the request of the Director, the Rector appoints by way of a decision:
  - 1) the Doctoral School's Admissions Committee, hereinafter referred to as the "Admissions Committee",
  - 2) at least one Qualification Team for each scientific discipline referred to in § 1 section 1, hereinafter referred to as the "qualification team".
2. The Recruitment Committee and qualification teams are appointed by the Rector for the period from 15 April 2026 to 14 April 2027.
3. At the request of the Chairperson of the Recruitment Committee or the Chairperson of the Qualification Team, the Rector may appoint new or dismiss appointed members of the Recruitment Committee or the Qualification Team, respectively.
4. You are entitled to remuneration for your work in the recruitment committee and in the qualification team. In the decision referred to in paragraph 1, the Rector shall specify the rules for awarding remuneration, the amount of which is specified in the Remuneration Regulations.

#### § 3

1. The recruitment committee consists of:
  - 1) Chairman – Director;
  - 2) one representative of the scientific discipline referred to in § 1 section 1,
  - 3) other persons nominated by the Director,
  - 4) secretary – Head of the Dean's Office of the Doctoral School.
2. By 20 March 2026, the chairpersons of the Councils of Scientific Disciplines referred to in § 1 section 1 shall submit to the Director the data of the representatives referred to in paragraph 1 point 2, selected from among academic teachers holding the academic title of professor or the academic degree of habilitated doctor conducting scientific activity in the field of this scientific discipline.

3. A representative appointed by the Doctoral Students' Government may participate in the admissions of the recruitment committee as an observer.
4. The administrative service of the admissions committee is provided by the Dean's Office of the Doctoral School.
5. The chairperson of the admissions committee convenes the admissions committee meetings and chairs its deliberations.
6. Meetings of the committee may be held remotely. Decisions on the form of the meeting are made by the chairman of the recruitment committee.
7. The meetings of the recruitment committee are recorded. The minutes shall be signed by the chairperson of the recruitment committee and the members of the committee participating in the meeting, subject to paragraph 9.
8. In the case of a meeting of the committee conducted remotely, the minutes are signed only by the chairperson of the recruitment committee.
9. In the absence of the chairperson, the meeting of the committee shall be convened and chaired by a member of the committee authorised by the chairperson.
10. Tasks of the Recruitment Committee:
  - 1) supervision over the course of the recruitment and qualification procedure,
  - 2) analysis of the correctness and completeness of documents submitted by candidates,
  - 3) preparation and submission to qualification teams:
    - a) candidates' documents,
    - b) a template protocol,
    - c) individual candidate evaluation cards,
  - 4) setting the dates of interviews within individual scientific disciplines,
  - 5) setting individual interview dates and notifying candidates,
  - 6) determining, on the basis of the protocols of the qualification teams, ranking lists in individual scientific disciplines and the list of persons pre-qualified to be included in the list of doctoral students,
  - 7) publishing on the website of the Doctoral School a list of persons who have been pre-qualified and, after verifying the documents referred to in § 14 section 1, a list of persons admitted to the Doctoral School within individual scientific disciplines,
  - 8) preparation of decisions on refusal of admission to the Doctoral School.

#### § 4

1. The qualification team of a scientific discipline includes:
  - 1) Chairman,
  - 2) at least two members,
  - 3) Secretary.
2. The Chairpersons of the Scientific Discipline Councils referred to in § 1 section 1 shall submit to the Director by 20 March 2026 the data of candidates for:
  - 1) the chairperson and members of the team - from among academic teachers holding the academic title of professor or the academic degree of habilitated doctor conducting scientific activity in the field of this scientific discipline,
  - 2) secretary - from among the employees of the department related to the scientific discipline competent for the Council.
3. Tasks of qualification teams:
  - 1) analysis of candidates' documents submitted by the recruitment committee,

- 2) analysis and assessment of the relationship between the candidate's Master's degree programme, other forms of education and scientific achievements and the scientific discipline of his/her choice,
  - 3) analysis of qualifications, competences and scientific achievements of candidates and awarding ranking points in accordance with point 2 points 1-3 of Annex No. 1 to the recruitment rules,
  - 4) analysis of the concept of the candidates' doctoral dissertation and awarding of ranking points in accordance with point 2 point 4 of Annex No. 1 to the recruitment rules,
  - 5) conducting an interview and awarding ranking points in accordance with point 2 point 5 of Appendix No. 1 to the Recruitment Rules.
  - 6) determining the total, total number of ranking points obtained by the candidate from all the criteria referred to in point 1 of Appendix No. 1 to the Recruitment Rules,
  - 7) submission of the protocol to the Recruitment Committee together with individual evaluation sheets of candidates and recommendations to the Recruitment Committee on:
    - a) pre-qualification of candidates for inclusion on the list of doctoral students,
    - b) a proposal to change the limit of places for a scientific discipline,
    - c) establishing a reserve list,
  - 8) preparing information for the Recruitment Committee on the course of the selection procedure in the event of a candidate's request for reconsideration of the case.
4. Meetings of the qualification team are recorded. The minutes shall be signed by the chairman and members of the qualification team participating in the meeting, subject to paragraph 5.
  5. In the case of a meeting conducted remotely, the minutes are signed only by the chairperson of the qualification team.

## § 5

1. A member of the qualification team is obliged to maintain impartiality and objectivity in the assessment of candidates for the Doctoral School.
2. A member of the qualification team informs the Chairperson of the qualification team of any circumstances that may affect his/her impartiality and objectivity in assessing candidates for the Doctoral School.
3. A member of the qualification team is subject to exclusion from the assessment of the candidate, in particular if:
  - 1) has provided the candidate with the statement referred to in § 6 section 1 point 3,
  - 2) was the supervisor of the candidate's diploma thesis;
  - 3) is the candidate's supervisor or is in another employment relationship with him;
  - 4) the candidate is or was his/her spouse or is a relative or relative up to the second degree, or remains or has been cohabiting with a member of the recruitment committee;

- 5) the candidate is or has been associated with a member of the committee by adoption, guardianship or guardianship;
  - 6) there are other objective circumstances that may give rise to justified concerns as to maintaining impartiality and objectivity in the assessment of the candidate.
4. The chairperson may exclude himself from the assessment of the candidate in the \_\_\_\_\_ cases referred to in paragraph 3.
  5. In the event of exclusion of at least two members of the qualification team from the candidate's assessment, the Chairperson applies to the Rector for the appointment of new members of the team.
  6. The exclusion of a member of the qualification team from the assessment of a given candidate shall be recorded in the protocol of the qualification team.

### **Section III Recruitment procedure**

#### **Chapter I Formal criteria**

##### **§ 6**

1. Candidates may apply for admission to the Doctoral School in the scientific discipline specified in § 1 section 1 if they are:
  - 1) have a master's degree, a master's degree in engineering or an equivalent degree,
  - 2) have a documented knowledge of English at the level of language proficiency of at least B2 according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR), subject to paragraph 5 – the template of the statement is contained in Appendix No. 7 to the Recruitment Rules,
  - 3) will obtain a statement from a potential supervisor on the list referred to in § 1 section 8 - the template of the statement is contained in Appendix No. 3 to the Recruitment Rules.
2. In exceptional cases, justified by the highest quality of scientific achievements, graduates of first-cycle studies or students who have completed the third year of long-cycle master's studies, including persons who have obtained the Pearls of Science grant meeting the requirements referred to in paragraph 1, points 2 and 3, may apply for admission to the Doctoral School.
3. Confirmation of knowledge of English at the level of language proficiency of at least B2 are only the documents indicated in Appendix No. 6 to the Recruitment Rules.
4. In the absence of a master's degree due to waiting for its issuance, the candidate is obliged to present a certificate from the university on obtaining a master's degree.
5. A certificate is not required for native English speakers.
6. Candidates may undertake education at the Doctoral School conducted in English if they have knowledge of English at least at the B2 level.
7. Foreigners may undertake education at the Doctoral School conducted in Polish if, in addition to knowledge of English at the B2 level, they demonstrate knowledge of Polish, i.e.:
  - 1) complete a one-year preparatory course for taking up education in Polish in units designated by the minister competent for higher education, or

- 2) have a certificate of knowledge of the Polish language issued by the State Commission for the Certification of Knowledge of Polish as a Foreign Language, or
  - 3) have completed their studies in Poland in a field of study conducted in Polish, or
  - 4) During the interview, they will receive confirmation that their preparation and level of knowledge of the Polish language allow them to undertake education in Polish.
8. If the Master's degree diploma was issued in a language other than Polish or English, the candidate shall attach a sworn translation into Polish.

## Chapter II Schedule of the recruitment procedure

### § 7

1. The schedule of the recruitment procedure includes:
  - 1) registration of the candidate in the Internet Registration of Candidates (IRK) system, completion of forms, upload of electronic versions of documents, payment of the recruitment fee - **1-16 August 2026**,
  - 2) Admission procedure - **18 August - 11 September 2026**, including interviews with candidates within the following scientific disciplines:
    - automation, electronics, electrical engineering and space technologies - **9-10 September 2026**,
    - Technical Informatics and Telecommunications – **7-9 September 2026**;
    - civil engineering, geodesy and transport - **8 September 2026**;
    - Materials Engineering - **September 10, 2026**;
    - Mechanical Engineering - **September 9-11, 2026**;
    - Security Sciences – **8-11 September 2026**;
    - Chemical Sciences - **September 10, 2026**
  - 3) announcement of the list of candidates pre-qualified for inclusion on the list of doctoral students – **17 September 2026**,
  - 4) issuance of an administrative decision on refusal to admit to the Doctoral School to candidates not qualified for inclusion on the list of doctoral students – **18-22 September 2026**,
  - 5) submission by candidates pre-qualified for inclusion on the list of doctoral students of the documents referred to in § 14 section 1 – **17-23 September 2026**,
  - 6) announcement of the list of those admitted to the Doctoral School - **25 September 2026**
2. The Recruitment Committee may make changes to the schedule referred to in paragraph 1 by providing information on this matter on the website of the Doctoral School by 15 July 2026, subject to paragraph 3
3. In the case of a large number of candidates, changes to the deadlines for the activities referred to in paragraph 1(2)-(6) may be introduced until 20 August 2026.
4. The letters referred to in paragraph 1 points 3 and 6 are published on the website of the Doctoral School.

## Chapter III

## Registration and documents to be filed

### § 8

1. Before registering in the IRK system, the candidate is obliged to:
  - 1) familiarize yourself with these recruitment rules,
  - 2) prepare electronic versions of the documents referred to in paragraph 4,
  - 3) selecting a potential supervisor and the proposed scope of research topics from the list referred to in § 1 section 8, having an initial interview with the potential supervisor about the possibility of scientific supervision and research topics and obtaining his/her signature on the statement - the template of the statement is contained in Appendix No. 3 to the Recruitment Rules.
2. Registration of candidates for the Doctoral School and submission of documents takes place only electronically via the IRK in accordance with the instructions available on the website of the Doctoral School and in the IRK system.
3. A candidate may register and choose only one scientific discipline from among the disciplines referred to in § 1 section 1.
4. After registering in the IRK system (creating an account) and filling in the forms, the candidate uploads electronic versions of the following documents (pdf format) to the IRK system, subject to paragraphs 5 and 6:
  - 1) an application for admission to the Doctoral School according to the template contained in Appendix No. 2 to the Recruitment Rules or generated from the IRK system,
  - 2) a diploma confirming the obtaining of a master's degree, a master's degree in engineering or an equivalent degree,
  - 3) a diploma supplement or other document confirming the course of studies,
  - 4) a statement of a potential supervisor – according to the template contained in Appendix 3 to the Recruitment Rules,
  - 5) the concept of the doctoral dissertation – according to the template contained in Appendix No. 4 to the Recruitment Rules,
  - 6) information questionnaire with attachments - according to the template contained in Appendix No. 5 to the Recruitment Rules,
  - 7) a statement of knowledge of English at the level of language proficiency of at least B2 – according to the template contained in Appendix No. 7 to the Recruitment Rules,
  - 8) curriculum vitae (CV),
  - 9) an information clause concerning the processing of personal data – according to the template contained in Appendix No. 8 to the Recruitment Rules.
5. Candidates, beneficiaries of the "Diamond Grant" programme, in addition to the documents referred to in paragraph 4, submit a document confirming that they have obtained the "Diamond Grant".
6. Candidates referred to in § 6 section 2 shall submit:
  - 1) documents referred to in paragraph 4 points 1 and 4-9,
  - 2) a diploma confirming the professional title of engineer or bachelor or a certificate of completion of the third year of long-cycle master's studies,
  - 3) documents confirming the highest quality scientific achievements.
7. A candidate holding a diploma confirming the second-level qualification outside Polish Republic shall additionally submit a translation of the diploma prepared

- by a sworn translator, subject to § 6 section 8. The provisions of Articles 326 and 327 of the Act apply to the recognition of a diploma as entitling to undertake education at the Doctoral School.
8. In the event of failure to submit the documents referred to in paragraph 4 within the deadline referred to in § 7 section 1, the recruitment committee shall call on the candidate to complete them within 7 days from the date of sending the request to the candidate's e-mail address indicated in the IRK system.

#### **Chapter IV Enrolment fee**

##### **§ 9**

1. The amount of the admission fee to the Doctoral School is determined by the Rector by 30 May 2026.
2. The candidate makes a payment to an individual bank account generated for each candidate by the IRK system, no later than **August 17, 2026**.
3. In a particularly justified case, the candidate may, by **7 August 2026**, submit an application to the Rector for exemption from the recruitment fee to the Dean's Office of the Doctoral School. The Rector makes a decision within 7 days from the date of submission of the application.
4. In the event of refusal to waive the fee, the candidate is obliged to pay the recruitment fee within 7 days of providing this information.
5. In the event of failure to pay within the deadline referred to in paragraph 2 or failure to submit the application referred to in paragraph 3 or the expiry of the deadline referred to in paragraph 4, the candidate shall not be subject to the qualification procedure.
6. The candidate is entitled to reimbursement – at his/her request – of:
  - 1) the recruitment fee in the event of resignation from participation in the selection procedure before its commencement, i.e. before 18 August 2026,
  - 2) overpayment.

#### **Chapter V Qualification procedure**

##### **§ 10**

1. The qualification procedure is conducted by a qualification team appropriate for the scientific discipline selected by the candidate and includes:
  - 1) analysis and evaluation of the relationship between the candidate's Master's degree programme, other forms of education and scientific achievements and the scientific discipline of his/her choice,
  - 2) awarding ranking points in the following criteria:
    - a) the result of completing master's studies,
    - b) qualifications and competences for education at the Doctoral School,
    - c) scientific achievements,
    - d) the concept of the doctoral dissertation,
    - e) job interview.
2. The qualification team awards candidates with ranking points in individual criteria on the terms set out in Appendix No. 1 to the Recruitment Rules.

3. The qualification team, to the extent referred to in paragraph 1 point 1, recommends a positive or negative assessment to the qualification committee. In the event of a negative assessment, the Qualification Team prepares a justification.
4. In the case of a person holding a diploma of studies completed outside Polish, the qualification team competent for the scientific discipline selected by the candidate may ask the candidate to submit additional documents.
5. In the case of a positive assessment of the candidates referred to in § 6 section 2, the qualification team awards the candidate 50 points for the criteria referred to in paragraph 1 point 2 letters a-c.
6. In the case of a beneficiary of the "Diamond Grant" programme, the qualification team awards the candidate 50 points for the criteria referred to in paragraph 1 point 2 letters a-c, regardless of the results obtained by the candidate in these criteria.
7. The number of ranking points of the candidate for the criterion referred to in paragraph 1(2)(b-e) shall be the arithmetic average of the points awarded by each member of the qualification team, rounded up to one decimal place, and shall not exceed the maximum value specified for the criterion in question.
8. The candidate's score is the sum of points for the criteria referred to in paragraph 1 point 2. The maximum number of ranking points that can be awarded by the qualifying team is 100 points.
9. After the completion of the selection procedure, the qualification team shall immediately submit to the recruitment committee the completed and signed documents referred to in § 4 section 3 points 7 and 8.

#### § 11

1. The concept of a doctoral dissertation is an introductory, synthetic description defining the basic assumptions of the planned doctoral dissertation.
2. The concept should include: the initial topic of the dissertation and the justification for its selection, defining: the research problem, the aim, research questions/hypotheses, methodology, the subject of the dissertation (novelty and originality) and the presentation of the current state of knowledge in the field of the adopted topic.
3. The purpose of the interview is to check the candidate's preparation and motivation to conduct scientific work and his/her scientific interests based on the presented research project and general knowledge of the scientific discipline.
4. Information on the date and place or form of the interview for candidates within the scientific discipline referred to in § 1 section 1 shall be provided to candidates electronically to the e-mail address indicated in the IRK system **by 28 August 2026.**
5. The interview can be conducted in a stationary or remote form using commonly available online tools. The preferred messenger is MS Teams. The decision on the form of conducting the interview is made by the chairman of the selection team.
6. A candidate with special needs may apply to the chairman of the recruitment committee through the IRK system for granting reasonable accommodations regarding the interview. The application requires justification.
7. Reasonable accommodations referred to in paragraph 6 may concern:

- 1) change of the place of the interview within the WAT;
- 2) changes in the form of conducting the call (stationary, remote using the MS Teams communicator);
- 3) extend the duration of the interview.
8. Information on the outcome of the application referred to in paragraph 6 will be sent electronically to the candidate's e-mail address indicated in the IRK system.
9. Before the interview begins, the chair or secretary of the selection team is obliged to verify the identity of the candidate.
10. The interview consists of two parts:
  - 1) the first part – presentation by the candidate of the initial concept of the doctoral dissertation prepared in accordance with the research topic agreed with the potential supervisor – max. 15 min.,
  - 2) The second part – questions from the members of the qualification team aimed at checking the ability to justify/defend the presented concept of the doctoral dissertation, conduct a scientific discussion and motivation for research work, as well as the candidate's general knowledge in the field of the selected scientific discipline.
11. The candidate's presentation should include the following issues:
  - 1) the introductory topic of the doctoral dissertation,
  - 2) justification for the choice of topic, results of the analysis of the state of knowledge in the field of selected research issues, literature review,
  - 3) initial definition of the research problem (aim, research questions, hypotheses, subject of the dissertation),
  - 4) the proposed methodology,
  - 5) expected results.

## **Chapter VI**

### **Results of the recruitment procedure**

#### § 12

1. Before accepting the protocols of the qualification teams, the Admission Committee may order the Qualification Team to re-analyze the documents and the method of awarding the ranking points.
2. A candidate may be considered within the limit of places for a scientific discipline to be entered on the list of doctoral students only in the case of:
  - 1) meeting the formal requirements referred to in § 6 section 1,
  - 2) payment of the recruitment fee, in accordance with the conditions specified in § 9,
  - 3) obtaining a positive assessment referred to in § 10 section 1 point 1 and section 3,
  - 4) obtaining a total of at least 50 ranking points, including at least 20 points from the interview.
3. Failure to meet the conditions referred to in paragraph 2 makes it impossible to enter a candidate on the ranking list of candidates even if the limit of places specified for the scientific discipline is not used.

#### § 13

1. The results of the recruitment procedure are public.
2. The admissions committee prepares a protocol on the recruitment process, to which a document called the ranking list of candidates is attached, containing

information about the candidates pre-qualified for entry on the list of doctoral students.

3. The order in which candidates are placed on the ranking list is determined by the number of ranking points and the fulfilment of the requirements referred to in § 12 section 2.
4. If candidates obtain the same total number of ranking points, admission to the Doctoral School is determined by the number of points awarded in the first place for:
  - 1) interview referred to in § 10 section 1 point 2 letter e,
  - 2) scientific achievements referred to in § 10 section 1 point 2 letter c.
5. In the absence of a decision on the basis of the conditions referred to in paragraph 4, the decision on admission to the Doctoral School is made by the admissions committee.
6. After analysing the preliminary results of the recruitment procedure, the Admission Committee may apply to the Rector to change the limit of places for individual scientific disciplines or to increase the limit of places for the Doctoral School for the academic year 2026/2027.
7. Candidates who do not meet the conditions referred to in § 12 section 2 are placed on the ranking list in a separate group below the candidates who meet these conditions.
8. The ranking list includes:
  - 1) name and surnames of the candidate,
  - 2) indicate whether the candidate has been pre-qualified to be entered on the list of doctoral students of the Doctoral School.
9. The ranking list is signed by the chairman of the recruitment committee and placed on the website of the Doctoral School of the Military University of Technology in the form of a pdf file.
10. Any deletions and changes made to the ranking list after it has been signed should contain a justification and be confirmed by the signature of the chairman of the recruitment committee.

## **Chapter VII**

### **Admission and Refusal of Admission to the Doctoral School**

#### **§ 14**

1. A candidate initially qualified for entry on the list of doctoral students is admitted to the Doctoral School after submitting to the Dean's Office of the Doctoral School no later than 23 September 2026:
  - 1) statements in accordance with the template specified in Appendix No. 9 to the Recruitment Rules;
  - 2) For inspection:
    - a) a diploma of completion of second-cycle studies, long-cycle master's studies or equivalent obtained on the basis of separate regulations or a certificate of obtaining a master's degree;
    - b) in the case of possession - a certificate of disability or degree of disability referred to in Article 5 and Article 62 of the Act of 27 August 1997 on vocational and social rehabilitation and employment of persons with disabilities (i.e. Journal of Laws of 2024, item 44, as amended)

2. In special cases, the chairperson of the selection committee may set a different deadline or a different way for the candidate to submit the documents referred to in paragraph 1.
3. Failure to meet the requirements set out in paragraph 1 results in the candidate being removed from the list of those pre-qualified for inclusion on the list of doctoral students and the admissions committee applying to the Rector for a decision on refusal of admission to the Doctoral School.
4. Candidates who meet the conditions referred to in § 12 section 2 and have not been admitted due to the exhaustion of the limit of places specified for the scientific discipline constitute a reserve group. In the event of vacancies on the list of pre-qualified candidates for the Doctoral School for the academic year 2026/2027 in the scientific discipline chosen by the candidate, these persons may, by the decision of the Rector, be admitted to the Doctoral School in the order resulting from the number of points obtained.
5. The Recruitment Committee immediately informs the candidate by e-mail to the e-mail address indicated in the IRK system about admission in this mode. The provisions of paragraphs 1 and 2 shall apply accordingly, whereby the candidate is obliged to submit the declaration referred to in paragraph 1 within seven days from the date of providing information about this obligation, failing which the qualification will expire by law.

#### § 15

1. Admission to the Doctoral School takes place by entering the list of doctoral students.
2. Refusal of admission to the Doctoral School takes place by way of an administrative decision of the Rector at the request of the admissions committee. The Rector's decision may be subject to a request for reconsideration of the case within 14 days from the date of its delivery. The decision is issued in electronic form and sent to candidates via the IRK system.

### **Section IV Special recruitment procedures**

#### **Chapter I General**

#### § 16

1. Recruitment of candidates to the Doctoral School under a special recruitment procedure takes place as a separate competition procedure, outside the limits of places specified in § 1 section 7, the rules of which take into account these recruitment rules and the rules specified for the programme, project, grant or agreement, hereinafter referred to as the "common recruitment rules".
2. The common rules of recruitment are approved by the chairperson of the recruitment committee after agreement with the representatives of the competent institution or the manager of the programme, project, grant or contract.
3. The special recruitment procedure for the Doctoral School is conducted by the recruitment committee and qualification teams referred to in § 2 section 1, subject to paragraphs 4 and 5.

4. The meetings of the selection teams and the selection committee as part of the special recruitment procedure may be attended by the representatives or managers referred to in paragraph 2.
5. The Chairman of the Recruitment Committee, at the request of the persons referred to in paragraph 2, may appoint additional qualification teams.
6. Special recruitment procedures can be conducted throughout the year. In the event of termination of the activities of the recruitment committee and qualification teams during a special recruitment procedure, the Rector may extend their activity until the end of this procedure.
7. Candidates recruited under a special recruitment procedure may be admitted to the Doctoral School for the academic year 2026/2027 only on condition that they ensure, throughout the entire period of education, full funding from doctoral scholarship programmes, projects, grants or agreements in the amount of not less than the amount of the scholarship specified in Article 209(4) of the Act, and a possible increase in the scholarship and co-financing of the costs of using research infrastructure, as well as financing activities related to the procedure for awarding a doctoral degree.
8. The period of education referred to in paragraph 7 also includes the period of suspension of education and extension of the deadline for submitting a doctoral dissertation.
9. The condition for admission to the Doctoral School and financing of the candidates referred to in paragraph 7 is an agreement specifying the conditions for the implementation, financing and settlement of financial resources for the financing of the scholarship or doctoral scholarships, the increase in the amount of the scholarship or scholarships and the costs of social security incurred by WAT and, if necessary, the co-financing of the costs of using the research infrastructure, as well as the financing of activities related to the procedure for the award of a doctoral degree.

## **Chapter II "Implementation Doctorate" program**

### § 17

1. Recruitment of candidates to the Doctoral School under the "Implementation Doctorate" programme, hereinafter referred to as the "DW programme", is conducted as a special recruitment procedure on the basis of the Announcement of the Minister of Science on the establishment of the "Implementation Doctorate" programme and the call for proposals.
2. Candidates for the DW program should be recruited from among the employees of companies and other entities cooperating with the Military Medical Academy.
3. The Recruitment Committee, after publishing the Communication referred to in paragraph 1, shall determine:
  - 1) recruitment schedule,
  - 2) a list and templates of documents submitted by a potential supervisor and candidate at each stage of recruitment,
  - 3) the manner and place or form of submission of documents.

4. Recruitment to the DW program is conducted by the admissions committee and qualification teams in two stages:
  - 1) preliminary stage,
  - 2) final stage.
5. The initial stage includes:
  - 1) registration of the candidate in the IRK system, uploading the electronic version of the documents, payment of the recruitment fee referred to in § 9 section 1 to an individual bank account generated for each candidate by the IRK system within the deadline specified in the schedule referred to in paragraph 3 point 1,
  - 2) submission of documents by the recruitment committee to the qualification team competent for the scientific discipline,
  - 3) Qualification proceedings conducted by the qualification team, in the scope of:
    - a) analysis and evaluation of the topic of the doctoral dissertation submitted by the candidate and the scientific achievements of the potential supervisor,
    - b) meeting the candidate's formal requirements for:
      - participation in the DW program,
      - education at the Doctoral School of the Military University of Technology in accordance with § 6 section 1 and § 10 section 1 point 1,
    - c) conducting an interview,
    - d) awarding ranking points for the criteria referred to in §10 section 1 point 2,
    - e) provide the admissions committee with the documents referred to in subsection 3(3) together with recommendations to the admissions committee regarding the candidate's qualifications for the DW programme.
6. A candidate may obtain a positive recommendation from the qualification team only if they meet the formal requirements referred to in paragraph 5(3)(b), obtain a positive assessment referred to in paragraph 5(3)(a) and score a minimum of 20 points from the interview.
7. Prior to the approval of the protocols of the qualification teams, the Selection Committee may order the qualification team to re-conduct the qualification procedure referred to in paragraph 5(3)(a), (b) and (d).
8. The admissions committee prepares a protocol of the course of the initial stage, to which, in the case of positive acceptance of the candidates, it attaches a document called the ranking list, containing information about the candidates pre-qualified for entry on the list of doctoral students under the DW program.
9. On the basis of the protocol of the recruitment committee from the preliminary stage:
  - 1) is submitted, through the Integrated System of Services for Science Servicing Funding Streams (ZSUN/OSF), an application to the Minister of Science for qualifying the candidate for participation in the DW programme, or
  - 2) in the event of failure to meet the requirements referred to in paragraph 6, the candidate receives the Rector's decision to refuse admission to the Doctoral School for the academic year 2026/2027 as part of the programme.

10. The applications referred to in paragraph 9(1) shall be prepared separately for each pre-qualified candidate.
11. The results of the preliminary stage are public. Information about the candidate's qualification or non-qualification is placed on the website of the Doctoral School and sent to the candidate's e-mail address.
12. The final stage applies only to candidates who have been entered on the ranking list in the initial stage and includes:
  - 1) the candidate provides documents for this stage, specified in paragraph 3 point 2,
  - 2) conducting the final qualification of candidates from the ranking list by the recruitment committee, subject to paragraph 14,
  - 3) preparation of the final recruitment protocol for the DW programme by the admissions committee.
13. The admissions committee may, at any stage of the DW program admission, ask you to submit additional documents to prove that you meet the requirements for participation in the DW program.
14. The final qualification is carried out only if the Minister provides information on the qualification of the candidate's application for participation in the DW programme for the academic year 2026/2027.
15. If the Minister provides information about the non-qualification of the WAT application for participation in the DW programme, the Rector issues a decision to refuse admission of the candidate to the Doctoral School under this programme, regardless of the results of the initial stage.
16. As a result of the final qualification, on the basis of the final protocol of the recruitment committee, the candidate:
  - 1) is entered on the list of doctoral students of the Doctoral School for the academic year 2026/2027 as part of the DW program, or
  - 2) receives the Rector's decision to refuse admission to the Doctoral School for the academic year 2026/2027 under this programme.
17. A candidate's participation in the recruitment to the DW programme does not exclude, at his/her request, participation in the recruitment to the Doctoral School for the academic year 2026/2027.

### **Chapter III**

#### **Other programs, projects, grants, agreements**

##### **§ 18**

1. Special recruitment procedures may also be conducted under other programs, projects, grants or contracts.
2. The detailed rules of the procedures referred to in paragraph 1 shall be determined by the recruitment committee, at least 14 days before the start of the recruitment process, taking into account the candidates' fulfilment of the formal requirements referred to in § 6 section 1 and the requirements specified for the programme, project, grant or contract.
3. Selection procedures carried out as part of the procedures referred to in paragraph 1 should be based on an interview taking into account the additional requirements of the project/programme, grant or contract.

### **Section V**

#### **Final provisions**

§ 19

1. In matters not regulated by these rules, the following provisions shall apply:
  - 1) Acts,
  - 2) Regulation of the Minister of Science and Higher Education of 28 September 2018 on the recognition of diplomas of completion of studies abroad and confirmation of completion of studies at a certain level (Journal of Laws of 28 September 2018).item 1881),
  - 3) of the Act of 14 June 1960. Code of Administrative Procedure (i.e. Journal of Laws of 2025, item 1691, as amended).
